CONTACT **BILLY LANGDON**:

The undersigned contacted **BILLY LANGDON**, 16 yrs., of _____, and he advises that he saw **KARL HEIKELL** about 1:30PM when he told **KARL** that he could not accompany **LANGDON** on his trap line as **KARL** was not wearing boots. He states that **KARL** mentioned something about going to Lake Linden to trick or treat, and mentioned that he might hitchhike.

JOURNAL:

11-2-81 **SARAZIN/MUSICH** UD-49, Missing Person Verification form signed by father, **LAWRENCE A. HEIKELL**. Contacted **TINA CONTRERAS**, who lives in the same apartment building (101 Scott St. Calumet) as **MONKEY & LURCH (STEVE & ROBERT GRONEWALD)**. CONTRERAS states she saw **KARL HEIKELL** in front of **SAKS (Superior Bowling Alley, 5th ST. Calumet)** between 9 and 10PM on Sunday night 11-1-81. Further, that **HEIKELL** spent the night at the **GRONEWALD'S** apartment. Officers also received information from **JERRY BUSCHELL, JR.** that he had seen **HEIKELL** in the **Houghton** area on the afternoon of 11-2-81, Monday. Officers also contacted the **GRONEWALDS** and cautioned them about the consequences or hiding a runaway.

11-3-81 **HALTUNEN** Contact **JERRY BUSCHELL, SR.** reference his son seeing **HEIKELL**. **JERRY JR.** states that he does not know **HEIKELL**, that he told them he had seen **LURCH(ROBERT GRONEWALD)** in **Houghton** as he had heard they were looking for **LURCH**.

CONTACT **TINA CONTRERAS**: (8:30a.m. 11-4-81)

Age 13 of **TINA** resides in the apartment above the **GRONEWALDS** and she states that she saw **KARL HEIKELL** and **MIKE BANFIELD** in the **GRONEWALD** apartment on Sunday night 11-1-81 at about 10:30PM. She states that she asked **KARL** if he was going home and he said "No, I'm not going home tonight."

CONTACT **RAY JACQUES**: (8:45a.m. 11-4-81)

Who lives in the same building as the **GRONEWALDS**, resides with an **ART NEUMAN**. **JACQUES** advises that both he and **ART** had seen kids in the building but could not identify **KARL HEIKELL** when shown a picture of him. Both subjects state that **GRONEWALD** could very well be hiding the boy.

CONTACT **WILLIAM BADGE**: (9:00a.m. 11-4-81)

BADGE resides at (TX across the street from the entrance to the apartment building where the **GRONEWALDS** live. He states that he has seen kids around the building and was shown a picture of **KARL HEIKELL**. He stated that if he recognizes the **HEIKELL** boy he would contact the post.

POSSIBLE SEARCH WARRANT:

The undersigned discussed the status of the complaint with **DET./SGT. J. AIRD** and it was decided that a request for a search warrant for the **GRONEWALD** apartment be made. The undersigned then contacted **PROSECUTOR MURRAY** reference the search warrant and while in the process of being drawn up, **ROBERT GRONEWALD** finally executed his apartment and was taken to the post by **TPR. HARJU**, where he was interviewed by **DET./SGT. AIRD** after which, **GRONEWALD** agreed to allow his apartment to be searched and the search warrant was not needed. **SGT. AIRD** searched the apartment, information in supp report submitted by him.

CONTACT **DALE KARVOLA**: (12:45PM 11-4-81)

At the **Ripley School**. **KARVOLA** states that he saw **KARL** last on Friday 10-30-81, when he got off the bus after school. **KARVOLA** states that he and **HEIKELL** have been to "MONKEY'S" (**STEVE GRONEWALD**) apartment on previous occasions, and that if **GRONEWALD** says he does not know **HEIKELL**, he is lying. (The undersigned had talked to **MONKEY**

POSSIBLE RUNAWAY: KARL HEIKELL

CONTACT PROSECUTOR MURRAY:

On 11-4-81 the undersigned met- with Houghton County Prosecutor RICHARD MURRAY and this complaint discussed. Arrangements were made with the school to obtain good photographs of KARL HEIKELL for distribution in the area.

INTERVIEW CARLEEN KARVOLA: '10a.m. 11-4-81)

CARLEEN KARVOLA of Lake Linden where she advises that she knows KARL HEIKELL, that he used to stay at their house in Lake Linden. Further, she states she talked to KARL around 4PM on Sunday 11-1-81, that he was across the street from the Quality Super Valu in Lake Linden, walking in the direction of Hubbell. CARLEEN also accompanied the undersigned in a search of the woods behind her home for a tree shack that KARL used to play in, with negative results. (The place was later found on a check made by TPR. HALTUNEN, with a friend of HEIKELL, and the place was deserted.)

SEARCH GRONEWALD APARTMENT:

While arrangements were being made to obtain a search warrant for the apartment of LURCH (ROBERT GRONEWALD), GRONEWALD exited his apartment and was brought to the post by TPR. HARJU, who had been sitting on the apartment while officers went for the search warrant. After a short interview, GRONEWALD agreed to allow the undersigned to search the apartment, and GRONEWALD returned to the apartment with the undersigned and was present during the search, which proved negative.

CONTACT TINA CONTRERAS:

Age 13, contacted at the Washington Middle School where she stated that she had earlier advised she saw HEIKELL on Sunday night and that he spent Sunday 11-1-81 night at the GRONEWALD apartment. She states that after thinking about it, it must have been Saturday night that he stayed there, because she did not get up the following morning for school. She states that she saw HEIKELL and DALE KARVOLA about 10:30PM Saturday night 10-31-81 in GRONEWALD'S apartment. Further, that KARL was in JOHN & VI'S restaurant at 9PM on Sunday night 11-1-81, and kept running back forth between the restaurant and SAKS, Superior Bowling Alley, which is across the street.

INTERVIEW DARLENE LAURN:

Age 13, of Laurium, who gives the same information as does TINA CONTRERAS. Both DARLENE and TINA feel that KARL HEIKELL is in the Calumet area and both state that they will try to locate him this evening 11-4-81 and if they do, will call the post.

MIKE MARTILLA & GLENN JOHNSON:

Both 13 yrs. of age. interviewed at the Washington Middle School. MARTILLA (of and JOHNSON) both advise that they saw KARL HEIKELL in a green and blue jeep, kind of beat up, with some person driving, and that they were buying gas at the Holiday Station. They state that this was between 1 and 2PM on Sunday 11-1-81. They state they did not see the driver.

INTERVIEW DARRELL KAUPPINEN:

Age 12, of interviewed at the Washington Middle School. KAUPPINEN states that he is the one who spent the night with DALE KARVOLA in MONKEY'S room. (MONKEY IS STEVE GRONEWALD) KAUPPINEN states no one else was there.

Information received from MRS. KAUPPINEN was that five young boys were supposed to spend the night together at a friends. She did not know he was at GRONEWALD'S.

At 2:45PM the undersigned recontacted MRS. HEIKELL and she advised that KARL is afraid of the dark and in her opinion, is not alone. She stated that he comes to town and can not find anyone to run with, he will ret-urn home.

HEIKELL INTERVIEW CONTINUED:

The HEIKELLS were asked about rumors that in fact, LARRY HEIKELL had abused or struck KARL on numerous occasions in the past, and LARRY HEIKELL states that that is one thing he has not done, strike his children, and was not as hard on them as he should be.

He states that the rumors circulating about KARL having severe bruises on him when he left home, and being the reason why KARL left home, are not true. MR. HEIKELL told the undersigned that he had located a tent behind Centennial Hgts. that he felt someone might be living in.

Prior to departing the home, arrangements were made with LARRY HEIKELL to accompany the undersigned to the area to check the tent. The check of the tent proved negative and was in fact, an old pickup truck cap turned upside down.

Also discussed with the HEIKELLS during the meeting at their home, were any suggestions they might have as to what else could be done in connection with this complaint. Further, they were brought up to date on everything that had been done thus far. Both MR. & MRS. HEIKELL felt that everything was being done that could be done.

Prior to leaving, PAT HEIKELL states that her daughter PATTI told her of a tree house located over in Tamarack Location and she was sure that KARL was familiar with it. Permission gained from the HEIKELLS for PATTI to be contacted at school and to accompany the undersigned to the area of the treehouse so that it could be checked.

INTERVIEW PATTI HEIKELL:

8th Grade Student at the Washington Middle School, contacted and she advises that she did not tell her mother about a tree house in the Tamarack Location, but did state that there used to be an old tent there that was now gone.

POLYGRAPH ARRANGMENTS:

On 11-16-81 the undersigned contacted DET./LT. WAYNE JOHNS and discussed with him the possibility of running a 12-year old on the polygraph. The matter was discussed with SGT. PETERSON and a polygraph date set for 11-23-81 at 9AM in Negaunee. This date was later changed to 11-18-81 at 9AM. Arrangements were made by TPR. HALTUNEN with DALE KARVOLA'S father to have him take the polygraph. DALE is to be taken to Negaunee by the undersigned.

MEETING HELD:

LUCILLE FLOURRE states that she has had seven stimulations and notes in diagnosing them, that KARL HEIKELL is dead; that there is dope involved; that he was very "high"; she advises that one of the stimulations involves a bathtub being removed and standing up; furthermore, that KARL HEIKELL has a very dark blanket wrapped around him. She states further that a woman is involved in his disappearance and that those are the pieces of the puzzle that the undersigned will have to put into place for himself.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

This date, TPR. JOE VANEVERA received information from one MRS. ALVIN DUPUIS of Lake Linden, that a check should be made with a WERTHA SCHUCK and a ROGER BALOWAARA, who have jsut recently moved to

The information is that BALOWAARA & KARL HEIKELL were friends and that he might be with him. A LEIN message was sent to the Manitowoc PD and response received from the Manitowoc County Sheriff that they had checked the address and that no one by the name of eihter SCHUCK or BALOWAARA lived there. Further, that the former tenant moved, and that new tenants moved in about five days ago, that theformer tenant had left without paying the rent.

The undersigned then contacted the Manitowoc Co. Sheriff Dept. via TX and talked to DOROTHY MARTIN. A further request was made that the parties living at the address of be contacted and asked to identify themselves and asked where they are from. Same to be done by the Manitowoc Co. CAROLINE advises that they brought him food, that he had bruise marks from beatings from his father, and that he was afraid to go home.

INTERVIEW ANDREA BOURNE:

A teacher at the Calumet High School, interviewed and she advises that the conversation related to the undersigned by CAROLINE BUSCHELL, was also overheard by her (MS. BOURNE) and that she had talked to LAURIE NICHOLS and in fact, after the conversation, had called the post, and talked to SGT. ZIEMNICK on 11-13-81, and gave him the information.

INTERVIEW LAURIE NICHOLS:

LAURIE NICHOLS interviewed at the Calumet High School on 11-16-81 at which time she admitted that she had lied, or at least not told the entire truth when she told CAROLINE BUSCHELL that she was seeing KARL HEIKELL behind the Morrison School.

LAURIE advises that this information was related to her by WALTER STAHL, that she herself did not see KARL on any occasion other than the one occasion already listed in this report, when she saw him on the Wednesday following his disappearance. LARRY HEIKELL advises that for the two weeks prior to KARL'S disappearance on 10-31-81, he was having a difficult time controlling KARL. He advises that KARL would go to school, fake illness so that he would have to go and pick him up, and that once he brought him home, KARL did not want to remain in the house.

LARRY HEIKELL states that KARL always wanted to be running up town and that they had constant arguments about his wanting to spend so much time in town and also about his running around with DALE KARVOLA.

LAURIE HEIKELL was picked up at her home at 12:15PM on 11-23-81 and brought to the post for an interview. LAURIE, age 15, was not living at the HEIKELL home at the time of her brother KARL'S disappearance, but was living with her grandmother in Hubbell.

She advises that she has not seen KARL since October 31st, that she did not see him for about a week prior to that date, and that she has received no information and has no knowledge of where KARL HEIKELL may be. LAURIE HEIKELL agreed to take a polygraph and arrangements were made for an examination for 11-25-81 in Negaunee.

INTERVIEW BILL LANGDON:


Age 16, of Centennial Hgts., interviewed at the Calumet High School in the presence of principal JOHN LEHTO. BILL LANGDON denied having any knowledge of where KARL HEIKELL might be, that he has not seen him since October 31, 1981, and that he has not taken food to him in a shelter, as has been rumored in the Calumet area. BILL LANGDON advises that he did purchase several sandwiches from the school cafeteria one day, but that he bought them for ERIC BLAU and left them on the table because BLAU would not come over and pick them up. He states that the sandwiches were paid for by BLAU and it was learned at this time that students can purchase the sandwiches for 20¢ a piece, and that BLAU gave him a dollar and some change with which to pay for them. No further information obtained from BILL LANGDON at this time.

INTERVIEW LUCILLE FLOURRIE:

Contacted reference her call to the post requesting that the undersigned contact her immediately as she had had another vision. MS. FLOURRIE first contacted via TX and then interviewed in her home by the undersigned where she advised that she has had more visions from the Lord and that she now knows that JEAN NARHI has disposed of KARL HEIKELL. She advises that she took him to a marshy area and dropped the body off after KARL HEIKELL died at her home where he had been brought by some people after he had taken an overdose.

A communication sent by LT. DENTON dated 11-10-81 advises that there is also similar items available out of an Arbor, according to 1/Lt. DAUST in Operations.

DARYL KANE CONTACTED:

On 12-1-81 the undersigned contacted DARYL KANE via TX at the above number and the following information received. KANE works at \$50/hr. with his equipment, that he prefers working at night, prefers working out of a helicopter, and needs some type of glass which is not a thermo-barrier, through which to operate his equipment.

He is available on a one-day notice and has references from Police Departments in Wisconsin, forwhom he has worked, and has just recently located a body in Wisconsin, with the use of his equipment.

FURTHER:

Attempts to be made this date to contact LT. DAUST to determine what equipment is available, and if it is possible for the area around the home of KARL HEIKELL to be checked, in hopes of locating his body.

DENTAL INFORMATION AVAILABLE:

HOTEL Bar in Bootjack between 6 adn 7 PM on Halloween night, when a subject entered the bar, and, through his actions, aroused the suspicions of one SANDY SCHULTZ, the bartender. When he left the bar, SANDY followed him and observed him get into a car and head back in the direction of Lake Linden. Just what his acticns were are not clear at this time, but had caused the bartender to contact a group of men in the bar and tell them that a man sitting at the bar was wearing a mask and that shewas afraid of him. SANDY SCHULTZ to be contacted and interviewed reference this incident because of the location of the Dreamland Bar, and the fact that KARL HEIKELL had told some friends that he was going to Hitchhike to Lake Linden that afternoon.

Information was also received on 11-30-81 from WILLY MATSON, that it is his understanding that DAN KLARICH of Calumet at one time held some children against their will in a house in the Swedetown location. This incident to be checked as the undersigned can not recall the incident as described by MATSON.

On the incident described above by ROGER GRONLUND, a car which the kids say is similar to the one that they saw, is a car owned by KAUPPINEN'S of Cone St. in Calumet. The car is a 1976 Pontiac 2D, brown in color, with a light-colored roof. ROGER states that this is not the car, but that it is similar to the one they saw on Haloween night being driven by the man wearing the mask.

In connection with the ad run in the local newspapers, on 12-1-81, SGT. R. JOHNSON received a phone call from one DIANE BAILEY, who runs the Village Beauty Shop in Laurium. MS. BAILEY states that at about 4:45PM, ^{on 10-31-81} she observed a man wearing a mask driving either a tan or lgiht-colored car near the antique bottle place, which is near the Detroit _ Northern building on 5th St. in Calumet.

She states it was an older model car in bad shape, and that it had black seat covers which were fluffy. She states that she took a good look at the car because of the mask the driver was wearing. The mask to her looked like a professional job. DIANE BAILEY had nothing further to offer.

All the information regarding the subject wearing the mask is being recorded in this complaint in the event something can be learned regarding this subject.

INTERVIEW PAT HEIKELL:

On 12-1-81 the undersigned contacted PAT HEIKELL via TX at which time she was brought up to date on the status of t-he investigation, and PAT advised that both she and her husband are available for polygraph examinations in the event they are deemed necessary. No polygraph dates have been set at this time.

ADDITIONAL:

The undersigned has now been in touch with LT. DAUST of Operations, who advises that the information on the use of equipment from Ann Arbor has been revised, that the equip- ment can be used only if the body is alive, and is of no value once the missing is deceased. LT. DAUST will contact to CAPT. FRIES this date, While CAPT. FRIES is in Lansing, about the possibility of Infra-red being used, and will contact LT. GRIMM.

No further description of either vehicle or subject. HELTUNEN looks very young and is a small person.

12-2-81 HALTUNEN Contacted MRS. CAROL HIPPIULA, who resides in with her 17-yr. old daughter, LORI. She states that she had not been in the basement of her apartment since last May, and that yesterday, she discovered that someone had apparently been spending a considerable amount of time in the back room. This was evident from numerous cigarette butts found on the floor, and also two slices of stale bread were found on the floor along with an open can of "MANWICH" sloppy Joe mix, which had been opened with a beer can opener. He states that on Monday 11-30-81, while walking along Co. Rd. INTERVIEW MINA POISSON:

Age 54, TX Interviewed on 2-9-82
and the following information received. The incident described as happening in the Union Building involving the young subject being there with what appeared to be a student, happened prior to Christmas.

She states the incident at approximately 11:50A.M. and that the subject came into the Union Building with a little boy and told the boy to order what he wanted. She states that the child appeared to her to be frightened. She described the man as a white male 25 to 26 yrs. of age, average height, slender build, perhaps 160 lbs. The subject had light brown hair worn over his ears, but could give no clothing description.

MRS. POISSON stated that while they were waiting for their food, the man pointed to the boy and said "he's my boss". She heard DOROTHY NUTINI ask him if the boy goes to school and the man said no. She also heard DOROTHY ask the man if he was a student and he stated he was not, that he was just passing through.

She advises that she overheard some conversation about opening a gas station or going into business together. She states that she did not pay any more attention to the two.

MRS. POISSON was shown a picture of JOHN BUDD and advises that he was not the subject with the young boy. When shown the group hockey picture, MRS. POISSON stated that KARL looked like the boy in the Union Building. However, when she viewed the individual photo of KARL, she stated that the face was too thin to have been KARL.

INTERVIEW SHIRLEY VETTER:

AT her home at _____, by the undersigned and the following information received. MRS. VETTER advises that she is a good friend of PAT HEIKELL and that PAT frequents her home and that KARL HEIKELL had been to her home on one occasion. She states that during the first two weeks following KARL'S disappearance, she observed two subjects sitting on a wall in front of _____ and the house just west of there. She states that the two subjects were not strange or unusual looking or she would be able to remember more clearly what they looked like, but recalls that they had with them a young boy who resembled KARL from the rear.

She states that she saw the two subjects with this young boy on at least five occasions four of them being near the wall mentioned above. It was during school hours which she thought was strange because the young boy was not in school. She tried to get a better look at the boy by going from one window to the other, and that the boy's hair style and body size was similar in appearance to that of KARL HEIKELL, but that she could not see the face. VETTER stated that the subjects would have hold of the boy's arm more or less as though they were guiding him and even though she thought it strange and was in constant contact with PAT HEIKELL, and in fact, was driving PAT HEIKELL around to search for KARL in the streets, she did not mention it to PAT HEIKELL because she thought it would be almost impossible for the person she was looking for to be sitting on a wall nearly in her front yard.

MRS. VETTER thought perhaps the subjects the young boy was with might live in the apart-ments either above the Needleshop or next door to it.

INTERVIEW KATHY BOND:

Of TX business of , contacted and the following information received. KATHY BOND operates the Needleshop and rents out apartments above the shop. The address of the shop is and she rents to six subjects: WILLIAM STICKLAND; JAMES CIKALO; RUSSELL BLINK; STEVE COCH; DAVID STODDARD; GERALD BONNEVILLE.

MRS. BOND states further that she also owns the house next door. at which is occupied by: TODD ZIEMS; CAREY WESTERBACK; SCOTT BRASEL. She states that BRASEL just moved in recently, since December and that prior to that, a JIM PETR lived there, but that he left sometime in November.

She states that all of the students living there are nice young men and does not believe that any of them would ever be involved in anything like the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL.

MTU SECURITY CONTACTED:

Due to the fact that the MTU Directory does not carry home addresses, other than local addresses of students, the MTU SECURITY DEPT. was contacted on 2-11-82 with a request for the home addresses of all the students living at both and in Houghton.

Further a request was made for any information available on JIM PETR who left the area in November.

COMPLAINANT RECONTACTED:

On 2-9-82 PAT HEIKELL was recontacted and advised of the status of t-he complaint to date.

As a result of the article, a call was received at the post on 2-2-82 from one DOROTHY NUTINI, WHO IS EMPLOYED at the Union Cafeteria At MTU.

As a result of the call to the undersigned by MS. NUTINI, DOROTHY NUTINI and one ALICE FRANZ were interviewed and the following information received.

INTERVIEW DOROTHY NUTINI:

Of at the Tech Union Building at approximately 10:30A date, and the following information received. DOROTHY advises that approximately four weeks ago and as long as up to eight weeks ago, a male subject entered the Union Bldg. Cafeteria at noontime and was accompanied by a young male subject which she feels could very well have been KARL HEIKELL.

MS. NUTINI states further that the two came through the food line and that because the subject seemed to be acting in a suspicious manner, she started to talk to him. She asked him if the young subject with him was his brother and he replied NO, that he was the boy's (at that point she is not certain whether he said guardian or protector, or something along that line.)

She states that during the conversation with him, and the conversation she overheard him have with the young boy, she got the impression that he was trying to persuade the boy to go with him, either to Kansas or Kansas City.

Further, that the young boy did not say anything, just looked at the subject, and that the boy ordered a hamburger and French fries. Further, at the times she saw the boy looking at the subject, she observed that the boy had very bad teeth, particularly an eye tooth. She states that the boy, who was approximately 4-8, was wearing a blue coat with hood. She could give no further description other than that he was very slight and had bad teeth.

DOROTHY NUTINI felt, after seeing the picture in the paper on Saturday, in her own mind, that the subject she saw that day was KARL HEIKELL. DOROTHY describes the male subject as approximately 5-8, slim in stature, sandy-colored hair, about ear length, and although she could give no further description, did hear the subject promise the boy that they would open up a gas station in Kansas City and that he would be the manager.

DOROTHY NUTINI states further that after getting their food, the male subject then went into one section of the Union Bldg. and she thinks that the young boy then played the pinball machines. She states further that she was so suspicious of the actions of the man that she went to the door to see where he was sitting and observed him sitting with three other men and a woman at what is known as a "community table".

She did not see the subject talk to the others at the table, and does not know that he just sat at that table, or that he might possibly have known them. She states that she had never seen that subject in the Union Cafeteria prior to that date that she can recall, but that it is possible that he could have been there, as they get 3-4,000 students a day in the Union at times. However, she is certain that he has not been there since.

DOROTHY NUTINI states that in her mind she associates that subject with a black hearse bearing out-of-state plates that was seen around the Tech campus at that period of time. She can give no reason why she associates it with him, other than a feeling that that is the vehicle that he is in.

DOROTHY NUTINI advises that ALICE FRANZ and a MENA POISSON also observed the strange actions and felt that the boy was either kidnapped or in some strange way, attached to the male subject.

No clothing description could be given, she does not remember any outstanding characteristics about his face or build, but is certain that he was very nervous and talked fast.

INTERVIEW ALICE FRANZ:

Of : interviewed at the Union Bldg. on the Tech campus this date and she describes the incident just as DOROTHY NUTINI did, although she did not hear the conversation about Kansas City. She advises she feels that the incident was long before Christmas and could have been as long ago as the first week in December. She could not give as good a description of either the male subject or the boy as did DOROTHY NUTINI, but stated that she felt if she saw the subject again, she would recognize.

She did state that she definitely felt something was wrong at the time, and that it bothered her so much that she was going to call Tech Security, but got busy and did not

Both women can describe the subject only as being in his late twenties or early thirties slight build, sandy ear-length hair, with no unusual features or characteristics that they can recall.

REMARKS:

MRS. MINA POISSON of TX is the third woman who supposedly observed the young boy and the subject in the Union Bldg. together. She was out on sick leave this date and will be interviewed on her return to work.

DR. HOWARD E. OTTO, medical examiner for Houghton County, was contacted and he also examined the property found. After conferring with his radiologist, DR. OTTO stated that the bone was that of a young male, and was the humerus bone. Further, the fingernails were those of a young human.

CONTACT PAT & LARRY HEIKELL:

LT. GRIMM contacted MR. & MRS. HEIKELL, the parents of KARL HEIKELL, and advised them of what had transpired, and they viewed the found clothing remnants and identified them as that of their missing son KARL.

- Item #3 - One plastic bag containing fingernails, tufts of human hair and a section of bone.
- Item #4 - One evidence bag containing baseball cap and hair taken from a hockey helmet (obtained from the HEIKELL residence, known to have been worn by KARL HEIKELL)

Items to be taken to the lab in Negaunee on 10-4-82 for examination and analysis to determine if the remains of KARL HEIKELL. UD-14's submitted. Held in post property room.

LOCATION WHERE FOUND:

Section 12 of Calumet Twp., Houghton Co. (SEE ATTACHED MAP)

OBTAIN COMPARISON SAMPLES:

The undersigned obtained hair samples from the victim's hockey helmet at the HEIKELL residence and placed same in a folded paper packet. Also obtained was a baseball cap frequently worn by KARL HEIKELL. Both placed in a Departmental evidence bag for transportation to crime lab. Same listed as item #4 in above listed property.

FURTHER INVESTIGATION:

On 10-5-82 LT. GRIMM and the undersigned (TPR. HALTUNEN) continued the search for additional body parts in the area where the clothing, etc. was found on 10-2-82. Officers located a bone that appeared to be leg bone, in a direction to the northeast, approximately 75 feet from the spot where the clothing was found. Further searching failed to turn up any additional evidence.

CONTACT DR. OTTO:

The undersigned transported the bone to the lab at the Portage View Hospital in Hancock where it was examined by Houghton Co. Medical Examiner DR. HOWARD E. OTTO. DR. OTTO tentatively identified the bone as a femur from the upper leg. It was difficult to determine the age of the bone due to the fact that the joints had been chewed off by animals.

The bone was X-rayed by the lab, same turned over to the undersigned and is to be forwarded to the Crime Lab in Negaunee along with the bone itself, for further testing.



In the days and weeks following, KARL'S disappearance was publicized locally which resulted in officers receiving a large number of possible sightings indicating that KARL was somewhere in the area, hiding out with friends, and leading officers to the false belief that KARL HEIKELL was merely a runaway.

Officers subsequently spent countless hours following up what are now known to have been false leads in this investigation. Complicating the investigation was the fact that KARL HEIKELL had a friend by the name of DALE KARVOLA who bore a close physical resemblance to KARL and it was later positively determined that many of the persons who thought they had seen KARL HEIKELL had in fact seen DALE KARVOLA.

Further complicating early efforts to locate KARL was the fact that a number of young individuals in the community had outright lied about supposedly knowing the whereabouts of young KARL.

At early stages in the investigation, several subjects were considered as possible suspects in KARL'S disappearance, mainly due to their homosexual tendencies. These subjects were subsequently eliminated as suspects and further, no hard information was ever developed that pointed in the direction of any specific individual.

On October 2, 1982, remains of KARL HEIKELL'S body were located by a hunter approximately one-half mile north of KARL'S home in a wooded area near a swamp. The few skeletal remains located were in fact identified as those of a young boy between the ages of 10 and 15 years of age. Further, the clothing found at the site was positively identified as that of the missing KARL HEIKELL.

Nearly a year after the discovery of the remains of KARL HEIKELL, PATRICIA HEIKELL, mother of HEIKELL petitioned the Houghton County Probate Court to have a hearing to determine findings of fact, and cause, site and date of death. This was done so that a death certificate could be issued and the family could have a proper burial^{have} and the matter put to rest in an effort to ease their minds.

On October 11, 1983 a hearing was held in the Houghton County Probate Court. For lack of any other information and out of sympathy for the family, the court at that time held that KARL HEIKELL did in fact die on October 31, 1981 of natural causes in Calumet Twp. of Houghton Co. Michigan. This finding led to the issuance of a death certificate and the subsequent release of the body's remains to the Peterson Funeral Home on November 9, 1983. A proper burial and service was then conducted for the HEIKELL family.

The investigation into the matter was closed on March 14, 1984.

DEVELOPMENT OF SUSPECT:

On 9-6-84 the undersigned was contacted by DAVE DILL, a Social Worker with Copper Country Mental Health. DILL was reporting to the undersigned under the provisions of the Child Protection Law which requires Social Workers to report to the police, incidents of suspected child abuse.

DILL advised that it recently came to light that ALAN PALOVAARA had sexually been abusing his own natural son and his step-son. Further, it was brought to his attention by the suspect's ex-wife, that ALAN PALOVAARA knew KARL HEIKELL and that there may be some chance that PALOVAARA might have been involved in KARL HEIKELL's death.

Arrangements were made to interview DAVE DILL at 2PM on 9-6-84 to obtain further information.

INTERVIEW DAVE DILL:

DAVE DILL was interviewed by the undersigned at Copper Country Mental Health, at 2:15 P.M. on 9-6-84. DILL advised that on August 13, 1984, ALAN PALOVAARA had called the C. C. Mental Health to make an appointment for counseling for a personal problem.

It was learned that PALOVAARA has an 18-year old step-son by the name of [REDACTED] and a 17-year old natural son named [REDACTED], both of whom reside with their natural mother, ALAN'S ex-wife, JANE PALOVAARA.

During the summer of 1984 the two boys visited an aunt in Warren, Michigan. It was learned that [REDACTED] had confided to the aunt that he had been sexually abused for a number of years prior to his 10th or 11th birthday, by ALAN PALOVAARA. Upon learning this information, the aunt called JANE PALOVAARA and apprised her of what she had learned from [REDACTED].

JANE then confronted ALAN with the information and he at that time agreed to seek counseling. [REDACTED] has since advised his mother JANE PALOVAARA of what had taken place.

This investigation has revealed that ALAN PALOVAARA, while still married to JANE PALOVAARA, and while living with JANE and the two boys on Waterworks ST. in Calumet, sexually abused both boys from the time they were approximately 5 and 6 years of age until approximately 10 and 11 years of age. This sexual abuse occurred at a frequency of at least twice a week for the five or six year period. The acts of sexual abuse included ALAN performing fellatio on the boys and the boys in turn performing fellatio on ALAN.

In subsequent conversations with ALAN PALOVAARA and from the very first contact, DILL advised PALOVAARA that this information is required to be reported to the police and was mandated by state law. DILL advises that PALOVAARA accepts the fact that police have to be informed and is being cooperative and expects to be interviewed by the police at sometime in the future.

INTERVIEW JANE PALOVAARA:

On 9-7-84 at 9:45 A.M., the undersigned and TPR. L. E. HALTUNEN interviewed JANE PALOVAARA at her residence at [REDACTED], TX. JANE is presently employed as a bartender at the Silver Dollar Bar in Laurium TX.

JANE advises that she was married to ALAN PALOVAARA on January 1, 1969. The marriage lasted until July of 1976 when they separated because, according to JANE, they were unable to communicate with one another. A divorce was initiated and finalized on January 31, 1977. JANE advises that while living together during their marriage, they resided on Waterworks St. in Calumet, amount one block north of Pine St.

JANE has two sons, [REDACTED], ages 18 and 17 respectively. [REDACTED] is ALAN's step-son and [REDACTED] his natural son.

At about the time the divorce was finalized, ALAN had found himself a new girl--friend and was living with a JUDY AHO, who prior to that, had been one of JANE'S best friends. JUDY and ALAN lived together on Union St. in Rambaultown until the relationship broke up in late 1983 or early 1984. JANE advises further that she once again is good friends with JUDY AHO despite the one-time relationship between JUDY & ALAN.

Following the couple's divorce, JANE continued to live in the house on Waterworks St. until August 12, 1978 at which time she and the boys moved to [REDACTED]. Two years later, on August 12, 1980, they returned to the Copper Country. During the two years in Warren, ALAN would have had no contact with either of the boys.

JANE was questioned as to ALAN's employment during the time they were married and advised that when they were first married, he worked at a gas station in Kearsarge. However, shortly afterward, he began working for and doing a lot of odd jobs for PAUL HEIKELL, and worked steadily for HEIKELL and the various other owners of a gas station and transmission repair shop located at the corner of Pine and 5th Sts. in Calumet. This location is now known as Mr. Radiator and ALAN continues to work there as a mechanic. ALAN was in fact working for the same business in 1981 at the time of the HEIKELL disappearance. However, at that time, the shop was located two blocks east of the present location, previous location was at the corner of 3rd and Pine Sts.

At the time of the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL, ALAN was working at that transmission repair shop with JOHN HELLA.

JANE was asked when she first suspected that ALAN might possibly be involved in the HEIKELL case and advised that it first occurred to her back in July when the allegations involving her two sons came to light through the boy's aunt in Warren (Jane's sister).

JANE advised that the Aunt had called advising that [REDACTED] had confided that he had been sexually abused for a number of years by ALAN. The boys had gone to Warren on approximately July 10, 1984 and the allegations first surfaced about July 16, 1984.

At that time JANE contacted PAUL & MARILYN HEIKELL as they were close friends of ALAN's and they at first did not believe the allegations to be possible.

On approximately August 13, 1984, JANE confronted ALAN with the allegations and gave him an ultimatum of seeking his own counseling or having the report made directly to the police. ALAN opted for the counseling and subsequently made an appointment with the Copper Country Mental Health Dept.

JANE states that she suspected ALAN as a possible suspect because of his close friendship with PAUL HEIKELL, and further, that he also knew little KARL HEIKELL. After learning without a doubt that ALAN had been involved in the sexual abuse of small boys, she thought of the possible involvement in the HEIKELL boy's disappearance.

JANE adds further that ALAN also knows PAT & LARRY HEIKELL, KARL'S parents and that the HEIKELLS were close enough friends for her and ALAN to borrow a crim from when [REDACTED] was born. JANE states unequivocally that ALAN knows the entire HEIKELL family.

She further relates that PAUL HEIKELL'S son, PAUL, JR., and KARL were cousins.

When asked to describe ALAN, JANE stated that he was a loner who did not have many friends, naming his best friend as probably PAUL HEIKELL. During the last couple years of their marriage, ALAN was drinking quite heavily and frequented PERKOS Bar, as well as SHARON'S Bar and the UP Pub.

JANE again advised that the only reason they divorced as far as she could tell was the lack of communication between them in the last couple years of their marriage. She advises that she attempted to talk to him for at least six months prior to a short separation in 1972 as communication was already a problem back then.

As for their sexual life together, JANE described ALAN as being normal in every respect as far as she could tell. She had absolutely no suspicions whatsoever that ALAN was homosexual until learning this summer of the incidents involving her two sons.

JANE was asked if in fact she knew whether ALAN would be familiar with the area around Centennial Hgts. and advised that "He knows that area like the back of his hand". She stated that ALAN enjoyed hunting and had hunted excessively in the area around and behind Centennial Hgts., and knew every road and trail in the area and was able to drive all the way to the Black Creek area by using the roads and trails that existed in the heavy woods.

JANE was asked whether she had mentioned her suspicions about ALAN'S possible involvement in the HEIKELL case and advised that she had in fact mentioned it to PAUL & MARILYN HEIKELL but the two dismissed the idea that ALAN could in any way have been involved.

She also discussed her suspicions with her very close friend JUDY AHO, with whom ALAN lived for a few years following JANE and ALAN'S divorce, stating she did so because JUDY also has a young son by the name of VANCE, and felt that JUDY should be made aware of the situation in the event ALAN had been sexually abusing VANCE too.

REMARKS:

It was noted that, from information gained from JANE PALOVAARA, the sexual abuse of the two boys would have commenced in approximately 1971 or 1972 at a time when the boys were 5 and 6 years of age. This time frame would have been approximately three years after the couple was married.

It should also be noted that KARL HEIKELL disappeared in 1981, approximately four years after ALAN had begun a new relationship with another woman in late '76, early '77.

TPR. HALTUNEN advised that ALAN having worked for JOHN HELLA at the transmission shop at the time of KARL HEIKELL'S disappearance might be relative to this investigation. At the time of the original investigation, TPR. HALTUNEN had talked to JOHN HELLA when he had received information that HELLA had seen KARL HEIKELL on Halloween night, the night of his disappearance.

TPR. HALTUNEN'S recollection was that HELLA had seen KARL at either the transmission shop or at HARTER'S Party Store that night after work.

INTERVIEW JOHN HELLA:

On 9-13-84 at 10AM, JOHN HELLA voluntarily came to the L'Anse post to be interviewed on this matter. JOHN is now the owner/operator of the White Oak Apartments at _____ and resides there in _____ TX ! _____ or during the day at _____ (Mr. Radiator Shop in L'Anse where he is also affiliated)

HELLA is a cooperative witness in this investigation and states that to this day he remembers seeing KARL HEIKELL on what he believes was the evening of his disappearance. HELLA states he is not positive of the exact date but very definitely relates seeing HEIKELL to the following incident:

In October of 1981 the Dodge Dealership in L'Anse went out of business and a large foreclosure or mortgage auction was held by the Bank. HELLA states that it was the day of the auction that he and his sole employee at that time, ALAN PALOVAARA went to L'Anse to attend said auction. They purchased a number of items there and returned to Calumet somewhere around 6:00 P.M. that evening.

Upon arriving in Calumet HELLA and ALAN unloaded the truck of the purchased items at the old garage out of which they were working, this being the small garage attached to the east end of the MARTHA MURPHY Apartment building, which still sits at the corner of 3rd and Pine Sts. in Calumet.

After unloading was completed, as best HELLA can recall, the building was locked and he and ALAN simultaneously left the area. HELLA assumed that ALAN was going home, and HELLA went directly to HARTER'S store several blocks away and it was at this location that he definitely saw KARL HEIKELL, and that he had even talked to him in the store.

Officers went over this information with HELLA repeatedly and he could not be swayed. HELLA states that he knew KARL and was familiar with him through the boy's father, LARRY HEIKELL.

HELLA was asked to describe ALAN PALOVAARA as best he could and described him as a loner who never really gets involved with anyone, and that he doesn't seem to really "chum" with anyone. He stated that in his estimation, ALAN has a drinking problem. He describes him as normally being quite quiet but when he drinks sometimes becomes a little cocky and mouthy, sometimes to the point where he could be described as obnoxious. HELLA states that the drinking creates a complete personal change in ALAN.

HELLA states that PALOVAARA'S favorite drinking spot was PERKO'S Bar where he went frequently after work.

HELLA further describes PALOVAARA as being "different", that he shows very little emotion. HELLA and his wife have discussed between themselves how ALAN holds all his feelings inside, never sharing any feelings with anyone. He advises that ALAN is the type of person who would never discuss a subject unless it was brought up first by someone else.

HELLA was asked if he could describe ALAN's relationship with women and advised that ALAN basically did not associate with women, that the only women he ever saw ALAN with were JUDY AHO and LAN's own mother. He described ALAN as being very cool to women and HELLA was under the impression that ALAN did not care for women, adding that "I always wondered about that".

HELLA stated further that in his opinion ALAN had no really deep feelings for JUDY AHO because he did not care for the idea of marriage at all. He advised that ALAN never entered a conversation that centered on women as most normal men would. HELLA recalled that ALAN was in fact living with JUDY AHO in Rambaultown at the time of the HEIKELL disappearance.

On ALAN's relationship with his mother, HELLA advised that ALAN quite religiously took his mother to Sauna on either Friday or Saturday night. Until recently, his mother lived in the MARTHA MURPHY apartment building, which is the location ALAN picked her up from.

HELLA was asked if he could shed some light on ALAN'S childhood and relationship with his father and advised that ALAN and his brother GRANT BALOWAARA greatly resented their father who was known as "BULLY" BALOWAARA. ALAN grew up in the Heights area and was infinitely familiar with it. HELLA also stated that "ALAN knew that area like the back of his hand". ALAN hunted extensively in that area because he grew up on 3rd St. in the Hgts. HELLA himself grew up in the HGTS area and used to play with ALAN in the same area that KARL HEIKELL'S remains were found. Further, the old BALOWAARA farm is located up behind the Hgts. area just north of the powerline road, and ALAN was also very familiar with that area.

Another thing HELLA noticed about ALAN was that, even though ALAN hunted with HELLA on occasion, ALAN seemed to prefer being out in the woods alone. ALAN does have a real like for guns, but HELLA cannot recall him ever carrying a gun except when hunting.

HELLA advises that ALAN very definitely knew KARL HEIKELL.

HELLA was asked if he was familiar with any of ALAN's hobbies and advised that besides hunting, ALAN apparently liked to read because HELLA often saw him looking through the paperback books in HARTE'S Store.

HELLA described ALAN's only close friend as PAUL HEIKELL.

HELLA was asked if he had any theories himself on the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL and stated that his only thought on the subject was that of the LANGDON boy shooting himself, and figured there might be some connection there. He further pointed out however, that whoever left KARL'S body in that particular area could not be a stranger because one would have to know the area well to get in to that location. He did not believe that anyone could easily become lost in that particular area as passing vehicles on the highway could be heard from anywhere in the area directly behind Heights.

Therefore, one could easily find one's way out to the highway just by listening to the traffic.

HELLA was asked if he could shed any light on the type of vehicle ALAN was driving at the time of KARL HEIKELL'S disappearance. He advised that ALAN was driving a blue Toyota which is now junked behind the Mr. Radiator Shop in Calumet. Further, he also drove a large white Chevrolet station wagon at the time, with woodgrain siding. The vehicle is still in the area.

VEHICLES LOCATED:

On 9-14-84 the undersigned and TPR. HALTUNEN located a light blue Toyota Grolla station wagon, 2-D with a roof rack and several windows missing, just off the alley between 5th and 6th Sts. on the north side of Pine St. The vehicle is located on the west side of the alley approximately 60 feet north of Pine St. This is the vehicle described by JOHN HELLA.

The second vehicle was located at PAUL HEIKELL'S Wrecker service located at the corner of 1st and Jefferson Sts. in Centennial Hgts. The vehicle is an older model white Chevrolet station wagon, full size, 4-D, with wood-grain sides, has Michigan registration 773AMX.

A check of the 773AMX registration showed it to be registered to ALAN PALOVAARA of P. O. Bpx 293, Gay Rd., on a 1971 Chevrolet Station Wagon VIN#166451J195172.

A third vehicle which is currently being driven by suspect PALOVAARA is a 1980 Mercury 2D Bobcat, bearing Michigan Registraton 485AMV, VIN#OX20A623856.

SUSPECT RESIDENCE:

It was confirmed that the address at the Gay location is no longer valid. PALOVAARA once maintained a trailer on the old Coal Dock Rd. in Gay. However, the trailer belongs to PAUL HEIKELL and has since removed from that location. It has been confirmed that PALOVAARA is currently residing at the small apartment located at PAUL HEIKELL'S wrecker service.

INTERVIEW PAUL & MARILYN HEIKELL:

On 9-14-84 at 1:10 P.M. PAUL & MARILY HEIKELL voluntarily came to the State Police Post in Calumet at the request of TPR. L.E. HALTUNEN to be interviewed. The HEIKELLS were not advised at this time that ALAN PALOVAARA was being considered as a suspect in the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL. The HEIKELLS were in fact aware however of the recent allegations that came to light involving ALAN in the sexual abuse of his two sons. They were advised that background information was being collected on PALOVAARA so that further investigation could be conducted into these matters.

At the onset of the interview, PAUL HEIKELL advised that after being requested to come to the post to discuss this matter, he immediately, while enroute to the post, contacted ALAN PALOVAARA and advised him that they were being called in on this investigation involving the abuse of his sons.

HEIKELL advised that PALOVAARA seemed a bit frightened, but appeared to accept it as he himself was expecting to talk to the police on this matter sometime within the near future. PAUL HEIKELL stated that when the allegations first came to light, ALAN had been confronted about it and did, in fact, make his own appointment with a counselor without any outside pressure or coercion.

PAUL confirms that he was a good friend of ALAN's and has been for many years. He stated that he was familiar with ALAN's childhood, describing it as "rotten", explaining that ALAN grew up on oatmeal because the family was poor. He went on to describe how ALAN's father was gone much of the time on a diamond-drilling rig, resulting in the children being raised primarily by their mother. He advises that ALAN virtually grew up without a father due to the long and repeated absences of the father from the home.

PAUL advises further that at one time ALAN was a drunk, that he had a severe drinking problem. However, to PAUL'S knowledge, ALAN did like his parents.

PAUL states that there was no indication that ALAN had any type of sexual problems until the recent allegations, and describes ALAN as a quiet, introverted-type person, who did not do much socializing. ALAN stayed pretty much to himself and did not become involved with other people.

As far as ALAN's drinking problem, in years past ALAN drank so much that he would give it up entirely for Deer Season, as being an avid hunter, feared the drinking would dull his senses. However, ALAN liked to be alone when he hunted and further, just liked to be alone at any time he was in the woods.

PAUL stated that ALAN like to read books about the outdoors, enjoyed photography and added that ALAN had been in the Navy. He further described ALAN as a very private person. Further, ALAN had never demonstrated any violent tendencies that he could recall.

INTERVIEW JUDY AHO:

On 9-14-84 at 7:15 P.M. JUDY AHO of Calumet, TX 337-0752, voluntarily came to the post for an interview. JUDY resides at the Rambaultown location with her son VANCE, 15 years of age. JUDY is employed as a bartender at the L&L Bar on 5th St. in Calumet, 337-9833. She has a current boyfriend by the name of JOHN LEHREAUX, who she advises is not aware of ALAN PALOVAARA's problem.

JUDY AHO advises that first struck up a relationship with ALAN in December of 1976 shortly before his divorce. She was working as a bartender at SHARON'S Bar at the time and ALAN was a customer. The two began living together when ALAN's divorce became final and the relationship ended in September of 1983 due to lack of communication. JUDY advised further that sexually there was barely any relations for the last year and a half as ALAN was not interested in have sexual relations. However, they had perfectly normal sexual relations for the first two years of their relationship.

JUDY described ALAN as being affectionate toward her and stated that he was a good sexual partner, as he took his time, not merely being interested in his own gratification. She described him as being conservative, preferring the "missionary" position when having intercourse. Further, for the first two years of their relationship, they engaged in intercourse almost nightly.

After the first two years, their sexual activity began to decrease rapidly, and there was virtually no sex between them for the last year and a half of their relationship. ALAN began going out and staying out all night hanging around the bars, but she never had any indications that he was seeing any other women. He was drinking quite heavily by that time and was even missing work. She advises that at the time of the HEIKELL boy's disappearance, ALAN was working for JOHN HELLA at Copper Country Transmission, and got along well with HELLA as the two had known each other since childhood.

JUDY advised that when he drank heavily, ALAN would become quite vociferous, but that when he was not drinking, was extremely quiet. ALAN had only a few close friends and was not a very social person. However, she states that ALAN was a very nice person, and was never physically violent with her during their relationship, that he never displayed any violent tendencies and she had never known him to be involved in a fight.

JUDY stated further that ALAN's favorite drinking establishments were PERKOS Bar and SHARON'S Bar, and were the only two places she knew him to frequent.

JUDY stated that ALAN seemed to have a really close relationship with his son but she never once suspected that anything unnatural or indecent was going on between them. There was never any indication that ALAN had homosexual tendencies.

JUDY advised that ALAN's drinking was a real problem because after just six to eight beers, on many occasions, ALAN had left her stranded to find her own way home. He would just forget that she was with him and just leave.

As for hobbies, JUDY states that ALAN enjoyed hunting, fishing, building model boats, read Western and Hockey news, photography, but had never known him to be interested in any type of pornography.

JUDY stated that she is sure ALAN would have known KARL HEIKELL as he knew all the HEIKELLS and visited PAUL HEIKELL'S place frequently.

ALAN'S favorite hunting area was behind Centennial Hgts. and JUDY confirmed that ALAN knew the area well, describing one incident after the HEIKELL DISAPPEARANCE, when ALAN took her behind the HGTS. area to pick apples, and told her that they were near the area where KARL HEIKELL'S body had been found. However, to her knowledge, ALAN had never joined any searches for the boy, nor did he get involved in any way in looking for the missing child.

As for ALAN's childhood, JUDY advised that ALAN talked a lot about his father's drinking, and said that he had a poor family.

ALAN never appeared to be jealous and never seemed to show any interest in other women.

Due to the length of time involved, JUDY was unable to give specific information on ALAN'S whereabouts on the evening of October 31, 1981.

CASE FACTS INDICATING HOMICIDE:

KARL HEIKELL was an 11-year old boy known to be healthy and strong. He did in fact attend special education classes because he was a little slow, but could not be described as retarded. KARL played on TPR. HALTUNEN'S hockey team and was found to be a likeable person. All reports on KARL indicated that he had a lot of friends and was easy-going and trusting. However, he was naive and was easily led and gullible.

All reports also indicate that KARL was uneasy or frightened of the dark. It was even known that KARL did not like to go into his own basement or the upstairs of his own house during the hours of darkness unless he knew there were other family members at home.

KARL was also known to be frightened of the woods and although he had a B-B gun, would never go far to use it, usually staying within sight of his own home. KARL did in fact however, like to be downtown with his friends and it was somewhat of a source of irritation between him and his parents who did not feel he should be hanging around downtown Calumet as much as he did.

KARL'S parents also did not completely approve of his friendship with DALE KARVOLA.

KARL was known at times to have temper tantrums and display certain attitude problems. However, it was noted that for the three days prior to his disappearance, he had a very good attitude and was getting along very well at home with his father. It is further known that KARL had no history of being a Runaway and that if he planned to be out somewhere for very long, would always call home.

On the afternoon of October 31, 1981 (Halloween) KARL left his home in the late afternoon, believed to be somewhere around 4PM. He had worked with his Dad earlier in the day cutting firewood and had also requested that his Dad take him out to shoot. However the dad was tired and promised to take KARL out the following day instead. Prior to leaving the house, KARL told his sister that he was going drinking with friends.

It should also be noted that KARL had called his mother at her place of employment, PAMIDA DISCOUNT STORE in Houghton, and requested that she bring home a Halloween mask as he planned to go "trick or treating" that evening. Further KARL had a conversation with BILL LANGDON (now deceased) on the afternoon of his disappearance and had told BILL that he intended to go "Trick or Treating" with friends that evening.

Finally, KARL'S good friend DALE KARVOLA had arranged with KARL to go trick-or-treating that evening. However, KARVOLA, () confirmed that KARL never showed up in town as previously planned.

Although times are somewhat conflicting, there are several possible sightings of KARL near the area of HARTE'S Store late on Halloween afternoon.

The most significant sighting, however, was that made by JOHN HELLA, who officers feel is very reliable, and who is unwavering in his account that he did in fact see KARL HEIKELL, who was well-known to him, in HARTER'S Store at approximately 6PM on the afternoon of October 31, 1981. It is also very significant that JOHN HELLA can positively place the victim KARL HEIKELL and the suspect ALAN PALOVAARA within three blocks of one another and within minutes of each other at approximately 6PM on 10-31-81.

Reliable sources interviewed reference this investigation who know both subjects also can confirm that they (HEIKELL & PALOVAARA) knew each other. Sources also state that PALOVAARA's favorite drinking spot was PERKO'S Bar, which is located on Pine St., two building's away from HARTER'S Store.

All sources also agree that ALAN PALOVAARA is infinitely familiar with the area where HEIKELL'S remains were found.

It was completely out of character for KARL HEIKELL to have gone alone into the wooded area where his remains were found late in the afternoon of October 31, 1981. On that date sunset was determined to be at 5:39 P.M. and darkness would have been rapidly falling at 6PM. HEIKELL was known to be frightened of the woods and did not frequent those types of area by himself. The average low temperature for October 31/November 1, 1981, was determined to have been 40° F. It is unlikely that 40° is low enough to cause a healthy, strong 11-year old boy to die from exposure. It is further known that KARL was also familiar with the Centennial Hgts. area and it is highly unlikely that if he did wander into that area by himself, he would have become so lost that he would have been unable to find his way home when only a half-mile from his house.

FURTHER INFORMATION:

On 9-14-84 TPR. JOHN JACKSON of the L'Anse Post contacted the Commercial National Bank in L'Anse and confirmed through MR. GEORGE KRAMM, that the Dodge Dealership in question was known as O.J. MOTORS and that the auction at that establishment was held on Saturday, October 31, 1981.

Further, TPR. JACKSON was able to obtain copies of two auction advertisements taken from local newspapers at the time.

This information is important because it confirms significant information provided by JOHN HELLA.

SCENE CHECK:

The undersigned and TPR. HALTUNEN returned to the area where HEIKELL'S remains were found and attempted to determine the exact location. Efforts were hampered by heavy rain and officers will again return to the area when weather permits to attempt the final check to see if any other physical evidence may be located.

DISTANCE DETERMINATION:

It was determined by driving from the area of HELLA'S Transmission Shop north on 3rd St. and west to Centennial Hgts. Rd and north into the Hgts. that traveling the shortest distance, a subject would travel approximately 1.9 miles to the location where it is suspected HEIKELL'S body was probably removed from a vehicle and dragged in a northeasterly direction for approximately 100 yards into the heavy wooded area where he was found. This area would be approximately one-half mile from the boy's home in a northeasterly direction.

STATUS: OPEN PENDING FURTHER INVESTIGATION.

POSSIBLE HOMICIDE: KARL LORENCE HEIKEL

JOURNAL:

11-17-84 BALL Have rechecked the area where HEIKEL's body was found three times with negative results, twice with TPR. HALTUNEN, and once with HALTUNEN, D/LT. R. GOAD, F/Lt. GRIMM and Lab/Spel. MAPES.

FURTHER INFORMATION:

On 11-7-84 the undersigned received information that suspect ALAN PALOVAARA had been talking about possibly leaving the area for the purpose of seeking work in Detroit, apparently because his present job was not going well. It was suspected that PALOVAARA may have learned that officers were questioning subjects reference the disappearance of KARL HEIKEL. However, it was known that PALOVAARA planned to remain in the area at least through Deer Season.

INTERVIEW LAWRENCE HEIKEL:

On 11-8-84 this officer and TPR. HALTUNEN contacted and interviewed LAWRENCE HEIKEL at his residence at 238 2nd St. Centennial Hgts. at 2:00 P.M. MR. HEIKEL was advised that officers had developed new information that might be related to the death of his son KARL.

HEIKEL was advised that ALAN PALOVAARA was being considered as a possible suspect in this case, but was not given specific details as to why.

Officers attempted to determine how close a friendship PALOVAARA may have had with KARL and the HEIKEL family. MR. HEIKEL stated that PALOVAARA was not considered to be a close family, describing him as more of an acquaintance. HEIKEL was not aware that his son had ever been close to or had hung around with ALAN.

REINTERVIEW MARILYN HEIKEL:

On 11-8-84 at 3:00 P.M., officers decided to recontact and interview MARILYN & PAUL HEIKEL as it was felt that they might be helpful in this investigation. MARILYN was at that time advised that ALAN PALOVAARA was being considered as a possible suspect in this matter. PAUL HEIKEL was not at home at the time and MARILYN explained that two days previous he had begun drinking heavily again. PAUL is an alcoholic but had not had a drink in quite some time. MARILYN advised that in his present condition, PAUL would be of no help in the investigation.

MARILYN revealed that PAUL had in fact been a close friend of ALAN PALOVAARA for a number of years but that recently, when it became known that ALAN had been sexually involved with his own sons, the friendship began to deteriorate. Approximately a month ago, PAUL & MARILYN had learned that ALAN'S sexual involvement with his sons was much more serious than had first been reported. She learned that ALAN had been having anal intercourse with his sons in addition to having oral sex. When PAUL learned this, he asked ALAN to move out of their apartment at the Wrecker Service Garage. PAUL now has a very uneasy feeling about ALAN and is afraid of him and does not trust him. She stated further that they have now considered the possibility that ALAN might be involved in the death of KARL HEIKEL.

INTERVIEW PATRICIA HEIKEL:

Investigating officers met with PATRICIA HEIKEL at the post on 11-9-84 at 8AM and interviewed her for any possible further information reference the suspect ALAN PALOVAARA. PAT HEIKEL stated that ALAN knew KARL "very, very well" and attributes the relationship

to the fact that ALAN constantly hung around PAUL'S garage, spending at least 3/4 of his time there. KARL also was at the garage fairly often. KARL used to chum with one of the [REDACTED] boys, believed to be [REDACTED], and was a close friend of his cousin, PAUL HEIKELL, Jr. PAT further believed that KARL had even been to the PALOVAARA home on Waterworks St. in Calumet.

PAT confirmed that JANE PALOVAARA had in fact borrowed a crib from her to use when one of the boys was born a number of years ago. The HEIKELL'S were friends with the PALOVAARAS, but not really close friends.

SURVEILLANCE:

On the evening of 11-8-84 officers set up surveillance at PALOVAARA'S place of business, MR. RADIATOR, in Calumet, at 4:20 P.M. hoping to contact and interview him reference this complaint, when he left work at about 5PM.

Prior to setting up the surveillance, Polygraph operator VERN PETERSON was contacted and agreed to remain on standby in the event PALOVAARA would consent to a polygraph examination.

Shortly after 5:00 PM on 11-8-84, PALOVAARA moved his personal vehicle into the garage on Pine St. and began what appeared to be an extensive repair job. Officers sat on the vehicle until 8:00 PM at which time it was decided to call off plans for the interview at that time and attempt to contact and interview PALOVAARA on the weekend, when there would be no excuse that he had to work.

INTERVIEW SUSPECT:

Undersigned officer contacted suspect ALAN PALOVAARA by telephone at his place of employment at 10:15 A.M. on Saturday 11-10-84 and PALOVAARA agreed to come to the post at 2PM for an interview.

PALOVAARA arrived at 2PM as requested and an interview was initiated by the undersigned and TPR. HALTUNEN. Prior to the interview, PALOVAARA was advised of his rights, same read directly from the State Police Advice of Rights Card by DET./SGT. BALL in the presence of TPR. HALTUNEN. PALOVAARA indicated that he understood his rights and would waive same.

Officers spent approximately two hours discussing background information with PALOVAARA and information concerning his sexual involvement with his natural son [REDACTED] and his stepson [REDACTED]. During the interview, PALOVAARA admitted that he had been sexually involved with the two boys from approximately 1972 until 1977. The last contact with the boys was right around the time that he and his wife divorced, and that since the divorce was finalized, there have been no more incidents.

PALOVAARA declined to give specific details as to what had actually transpired between himself and his sons, but did admit to having both oral and anal sex with them. He stated also that he was more involved with [REDACTED] than he was with [REDACTED].

PALOVAARA could give no reason for becoming sexually involved with the boys, stating only that he had not had these tendencies earlier in his life. He related times when he was in the Navy in California and was presented with the opportunity for homosexual involvement but was repulsed by the idea at the time. Further, he states he has no involvement with any other subject, including VANCE AHO, the son of the woman he lived with following the divorce from his wife JANE.

PALOVAARA, without hesitation, offered to submit to a polygraph examination to clear himself of any involvement with VANCE AHO.

PALOVAARA advised that he intends to continue counseling as he is attempting to learn for his own satisfaction, what prompted his becoming sexually involved with the boys.

At approximately 4:15 P.M., officers advised PALOVAARA that he was being considered as a possible suspect in the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL. PALOVAARA stated that he did in fact know KARL and had spoken to him on several occasions, but had never hung with him nor taken him anywhere in a vehicle. He further denied having ever supplied KARL with either liquor or drugs. He advised that it was his own feeling that KARL had disappeared as a result of foul play.

PALOVAARA stated unequivocally that he had nothing to do with the disappearance of KARL HEIKELL and officers noted that he was able to discuss the matter without being overly nervous. The only signs of any degree of nervousness were when it was first suggested to him that he was being considered as a possible suspect. However, after getting into the conversation about KARL HEIKELL, PALOVAARA appeared to be relaxed and not overly concerned. He did in fact agree to submit to a polygraph examination to clear himself of any suspicions.

POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION:

Officers left the post at 4:30 P.M. and arrived in Negaunee at 6:30 P.M. Shortly after 7:00 P.M., LT. VERN PETERSON began the polygraph examination on ALAN PALOVAARA. At the conclusion of the examination LT. PETERSON
